Tuition & Fees | 2024-2025

Application/Enrollment Fees are non-refundable. They cover all textbooks, workbooks, a student t-shirt, P.E. shorts for grades 5-8th, a CCS sweatshirt, and any required standardized testing. Enrollment fees do not cover uniforms or field trips. This is a yearly cost and is additional to tuition. Students will be responsible for a list of "school supplies" that are not covered by this fee.

KINDERGARTEN:

\$6,100 Tuition + \$250 Once-Yearly Enrollment Fee

Kindergarten begins at 8:30 a.m and ends at 12:30 p.m. All core subjects and preparation for Grammar School will take place during these hours. Kindergarten is a special, yet critical time for our students! It is here where their careful beginnings in elements such as learning proper pencil grip, classroom structure, and immersion in what is true, good, and beautiful take place. Students will bring a snack for a mid-morning break, and eat lunch at home after pickup. All Kindergarteners must be five years old and bathroom independent before the first day of school (please see the Kindergarten Readiness Checklist on our website for more information).

KINDERGARTEN INTERLUDIT:

\$1,700

Interludit translated from Latin means "rest and play." This is offered as a service to parents of Kindergarteners; Interludit bridges the end-of-day time gap between 12:30 p.m. and 2:45 p.m. Interludit children will enjoy lunch and recess with their classmates, followed by a rest period. The last hour of the day will be free play, crafts, or games. This program is only open to students enrolled in Canterbury's Kindergarten program, and is not eligible for any kind of tuition assistance.

GRAMMAR SCHOOL | 1st Grade - 6th Grade:

\$6,100 + \$250 (Grade 1) or \$360 (Grades 2-6) Once-Yearly Enrollment Fee

After a year of training in Kindergarten, most students are ready for a full day of Grammar School, which begins at 8:30 a.m., and goes through 2:45 p.m., including an hour for lunch and recess! Grammar School continues to build a strong educational foundation, mastering memorization of math facts, phonics, and eventually grammar. Enrichment classes such as art, music, and P.E. are also introduced at this time. In the Classical model, these years are known as the Grammar stage of the Trivium. The Grammar stage capitalizes on younger

children's incredible ability to memorize and retain, absorbing facts through songs and chants, repetition and rhyme. Students in grades 2 and below are offered a quarterly Progress Report with a "Needs Improvement, Satisfactory, and Excellent" scale. In preparation for Logic School, 3-5th Grade students begin to receive traditional grades via a quarterly Report Card, based on a ten point scale. (*Grammar School Students who have an older sibling in Logic or Rhetoric School must be picked up by 3:00 p.m.*)

LOGIC SCHOOL | 7th Grade - 8th Grade:

\$6,300 + \$420 Once-Yearly Enrollment Fee

By seventh grade, students are naturally ready for the Logic stage of the Trivium. The Logic stage takes advantage of the middle years which are full of questions and the desire to understand "why." At Canterbury, our Logic School students' day begins at 8:15 a.m., and goes through 3:00 p.m., with nearly an hour for lunch and recess. In preparation for Rhetoric School, Logic School students transition to multiple teachers, some homework, and more responsibility, with the goal of training them for independent learning later in life. Math becomes more subject focused (Pre-Algebra, Algebra), rather than "grade level" focused. Logic School students also enjoy enrichment classes such as art, music, and P.E. Students receive traditional grades via a quarterly Report Card, based on a ten point scale.

RHETORIC SCHOOL | 9th Grade - 12th Grade:

\$6,900 + \$470 Once-Yearly Enrollment Fee

By the time a student gets to High School, they are ready for the Rhetoric stage, which gives them room to determine and defend their positions on what they have memorized and come to understand. If a Rhetoric School student has been on the Classical track for some time, they have completed their Latin training and will begin to tackle the Spanish language, in addition to challenging coursework in logic, literature, and classical studies among others. They are now prepared to really use and refine their writing skills. Arts exposure is still woven throughout all subjects, but additionally students enjoy a variety of arts courses taken over the four years of Rhetoric School. At Canterbury, we introduce typing in Rhetoric School, to prepare students for university level coursework. School hours are 8:15 a.m. to 3:00 p.m., which includes nearly one hour for lunch and free time. Rhetoric School students receive traditional grades via a quarterly Report Card, based on the College Board's grading scale. At Canterbury, our Rhetoric Students' GPAs include weighted honors classes.

Commencement Package | 12th Grade:

\$120

All Rhetoric school senior's *Commencement Package* includes the graduate's diploma, cap, gown, stole and tassel regalia, and House color cord along with related cords that honor the top students.

TUITION ASSISTANCE:

- Canterbury is delighted to participate in the North Carolina State Education Assistance Aurthority's programs: The Opportunity Scholarship Program and The Education Student Account Program (ESA+) (For additional information, visit www.ncseaa.edu).
- In house, we are able to offer a 20% sibling tuition discount for families with multiple students enrolled. After one full price of tuition, the remaining siblings become eligible for the 20% deduction. The discount must be taken on the lowest tuition rate. No discounts apply on Enrollment Fees nor the Application Fee.
